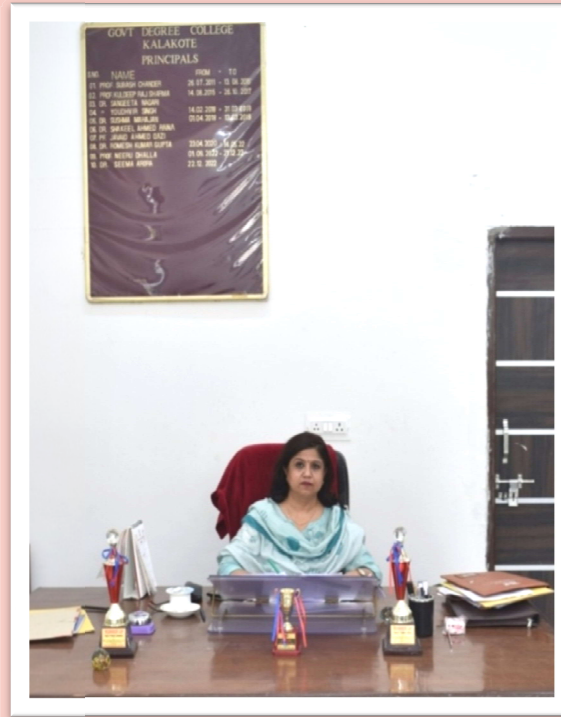

Government Degree College Kalakote - A Profile

Government Degree College Kalakote is situated in the picturesque village of Sair, nestled amidst a series of mountains, dense forests, lush green pastures, and meandering streams, approximately 120 kilometers away from Jammu. The college, established in 2011, has shown remarkable performance despite its limited infrastructure. Recognized by the UGC under 2(F) category, it is affiliated with the University of Jammu.

The construction of college commenced in 2017 on a scenic piece of land measuring 38 Kanals and 16 Marlas, provided by the J&K Mineral Department in 2015. It comprises two main buildings: an Administrative Block and an Academic Block. The Administrative Block houses the Principal's Chamber, Establishment Section, Conference Hall, and Visitor's Room, while the Academic Block includes eight classrooms, two examination halls, a computer lab, a library, IQAC office, Sports Room, NSS office, and two staff rooms. Separate toilet blocks for girls and boys are available. All classrooms are equipped with modern teaching aids such as interactive boards, podiums, projectors, and desks. CCTV surveillance have been strategically installed to monitor the activities of both students and staff members.

Academic Session and Admission

Academic Session Shall Start From the Date Notified By Jammu University

- Admission is open to all the citizens of India.
- Students seeking admission in B.A/B.Sc. Semester-1st shall apply on the prescribed form appended with the prospectus.
- Change of subject is not permissible after admission.
- Students belonging to reserved categories shall submit the relevant certificate (attested copy) issued by the competent authority with the admission form.

Documents and Testimonials Required

The following certificates testimonials must be attached with the admission form.

- Provisional certificates (original) issued by the institution last attended / J&K Board of School Education.

- Character certificate (original) issued by the head of the institution last attended.
- Marks sheet of the qualifying examination i.e. CUET-UG 2023 (one original and four self-attested copies).
- Four self-attested copies of the recent passport size photograph.
- 12th Standard certificate (original along with two self-attested copies).
- Matriculation certificate (original along with two self-attested copies).
- Reserved category certificate from the competent authority (self-attested copy).
- Migration certificate for the students of Board/University other than J&K Board & University of Jammu respectively.
- In case of private candidate a character certificate should be signed by the first class magistrate or SHO.

Affidavit/Undertaking

The following undertaking to be taken in the form of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper attested by first class Magistrate/Notary to be obtained from every selected candidate.

1. That I am seeking admission to Bachelor of Arts in Government Degree College Kalakote for the session 2024-25 on the basis of my merit in the qualifying examination.
2. That I have not sought admission in any academic/professional/technical government/private institute inside or outside the state.
3. That in case I seek admission or get selected in any academic/professional/technical government/private institute, I shall immediately bring to the notice of the college authorities and that I shall get myself discharge from the college before getting myself admitted to any of the above mentioned institutions.
4. That I shall abide by the rules and norms of the college in order to keep the decorum and discipline of the college. I further undertake that I shall not misbehave/indulge in any unlawful and anti-social activity such as ragging and shall be liable to be punished up to the extent of expulsion from the college in case I am found involved in the unlawful activities.
5. That I am seeking provisional admission to BA Semester I in Government Degree College Kalakote with the clear understanding that my admission to BA Semester I is provisional and is subject to confirmation with on the issue of the certificate of eligibility by the University of Jammu, if for any reason whatsoever the University declines to issue the said certificate, my provisional admission will automatically stands cancelled.

1. That I have passed my 10 + 2 Examination during the session as a private/regular candidate from Board.
2. That I am seeking admission in Government Degree College Kalakote in B.A. semester during the session 2024-25.
3. That during the gap period, I was neither employed nor I have sought admission in any other Academic / Professional / Technical Government / Private Institution..

Admission Rules

- The B.A. Semester-I admission shall be open to a candidate who has qualified the Intermediate (10+2).
- No candidate who wishes to enter a course of study prescribed by the University shall be admitted to an affiliated or a constituent college unless he/she has passed the qualifying examination for admission to such course as prescribed by the Statutes.
- The Principal of a constituent/affiliated college shall be competent to cancel admission of a student enrolled for a programme of study in the college if he/she remains absent continuously for a period of 20 days without permission of the Principal concerned.
- A student who is admitted to the college and completes the minimum required attendance but either fails or does not appear in the ensuing University examination will be considered for admission in the same class.
- A student with a break in academic career will not be considered for admission in the college.
- Change of subjects is not permitted after admission.
- Admission to a particular stream/subject combination shall be purely on the availability of seats.
- **Admission fee is non-refundable.**

Evaluation and Examination

Internal Assessment and Tutorial under Semester system (NEP-2020)

40 % of the marks in the papers of Major/Minor are reserved for Internal Assessment and Tutorial.

The distribution of marks is as:

- Internal Assignment = 15%
- Tutorial = 25%

Whereas, 20% of the marks in the papers of Multidisciplinary, Ability Enhancement Courses, Skill Enhancement Courses and Value Added Courses are reserved for Internal Assessment.

External Evaluation

A student is permitted to take the university examination subject to the fulfillment of the following eligibility requirement:

- A student cannot sit in the university examination unless he/she has attended 75% of the total lectures delivered during the session in each theory subject.

- Not more than 30 duties in all shall be given to a student who has participated in sports/NSS or any other co-curricular activities of the college during the entire academic session.

A student has to pass in the Internal Assessment, Tutorial and External Assessment separately.

Condonation of Lectures

The Principal can condone shortage in attendance of a student in each subject to five lectures.

Promotion Criteria under Semester System

1. A student will be eligible for promotion from Semester-I to II, if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessments of all papers of the semester –I
2. A student will be eligible for promotion from Semester-II to III provided he/she has earned at least 50% of the total credits of Semester-I as well as passed in internal assessments of all papers of Semester-II
3. A student will be eligible for promotion from Semester-III to IV, if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessments of all papers of the semester-III
4. A student will be eligible for promotion from Semester-IV to V provided he/she has passed till Semester-II and 50 % of the total credits of Semester-III as well as passed in internal assessment of all papers of Semester-IV.
5. A student will be eligible for promotion from Semester-V to VI, if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessments of all papers of the semester-V
6. Only those candidates who have successfully completed first five semesters with 75% marks and above shall be allowed to continue fourth year of the Under Graduate Programme to obtain the Bachelor's Degree (Honors with Research)
7. A student will be eligible for promotion from Semester-VII to VIII if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessments of the Semester-VII.
8. A student who has to reappear in paper(s) prescribed for Semester-VI and VIII shall appear in the supplementary examination.

Violation of Uniform rules

1. Wearing of college uniform shall be compulsory for all students. However, in unavoidable circumstances or cases where uniform requires exemption, special permission for exemption shall have to be sought from the college Principal.
2. Uniform shall be compulsory on all days of the week.

College Library

The College Library is located in the Academic Block of the College. It is well equipped with the collection of more than twenty-four thousand books, comprising text books, reference books, literary books, novels, encyclopedias, journals, competition books, etc

Library Rules

1. The college library is open for students and staff from 9:30 AM to 3:30 PM on all working days.
2. Books will be issued to the students on production of the library Card, which is issued to him/her at the start of the Academic session by the college library.
3. In case the card is lost, the students should bring this to the notice of the librarian at once to avoid any misuse of the card. A duplicate card will be issued on a payment of Rs. 200/- after proper verification. A damaged card can be replaced by surrendering it along with a payment of Rs. 100/-.
4. Books lost or damaged in any way shall have to be replaced by the borrower, failing which double the cost of the book shall be charged. The borrower should satisfy himself/herself about the sound condition of the book before leaving the counter.
5. Books are issued for a period of 15 days only and a fine of Re. 1/- per day shall be charged after the due date for 15 days and after that Re. 2/- per day shall be charged.
6. Reference books, rare books, books especially reserved and current periodicals will not be issued for use at home; these can be consulted only within the library premises.
7. Students can borrow a maximum of two books from the Library at a time.

8. Strict silence shall be observed in the library and reading rooms. Students shall not take their personal books or belongings inside the library.
9. Students appearing for the university examinations shall surrender their library Card/books before receiving their roll number slips. Students failing to surrender their cards at that time shall have to deposit a fine of Rs.200/-

Scholarship and financial assistance

Various scholarships are granted to various categories of students

1. Schedule Caste scholarship
2. Backward Caste scholarship
3. National scholarship
4. Scholarship for physically challenged
5. Pahari speaking scholarship
6. Schedule tribe scholarship

The grant and continuance of the scholarship is subject to the following conditions:

1. Regular attendance
2. Satisfactory conduct
3. Production of income certificate/other certificates as and when required
4. Attested copy of Domicile certificate

Applications for the grant of the scholarship are dully scrutinized by the committee of teachers who recommends the deserving cases to the principal.

Students applying for the scholarship are required to submit the following particulars

1. Father/guardian's occupation certificate
2. Income Certificate of the father/Guardian
3. Attested copy of Domicile certificate
4. Category certificate issued by the competent authority
5. Testimonials if any.

The income certificate of the father/guardian should be issued and certified by the revenue officer not less than the rank of the Tehsildar. Scholarship of the students who do not show satisfactory academic progress will be stopped as the case may be.

Career Counseling Cell

The college has career counseling cell under the guidelines of senior faculty of the college. The career counseling cell provides information regarding the subject combination and counsels the students.

Women Counseling Cell/Protection Cell

The college has a women counseling/ protection cell to deal with the problems exclusively faced by the female students. Members of the cell shall meet at least once in a fortnight to listen the problems of female students and to find workable solution to their problems.

Co-curricular Activities

Beside teaching programmes, the college provides maximum possible opportunities to the students for the expression of their talent through various programmes like debates, discussions, quizzes, and symposiums. Literary activities like essay writing, poetry recitation, painting competition and varieties of programmes are held at various levels.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The college has one unit of NSS consisting of 100 volunteers. The unit functions under a programme officer. The students have to apply on a prescribed form to seek admission in the unit.

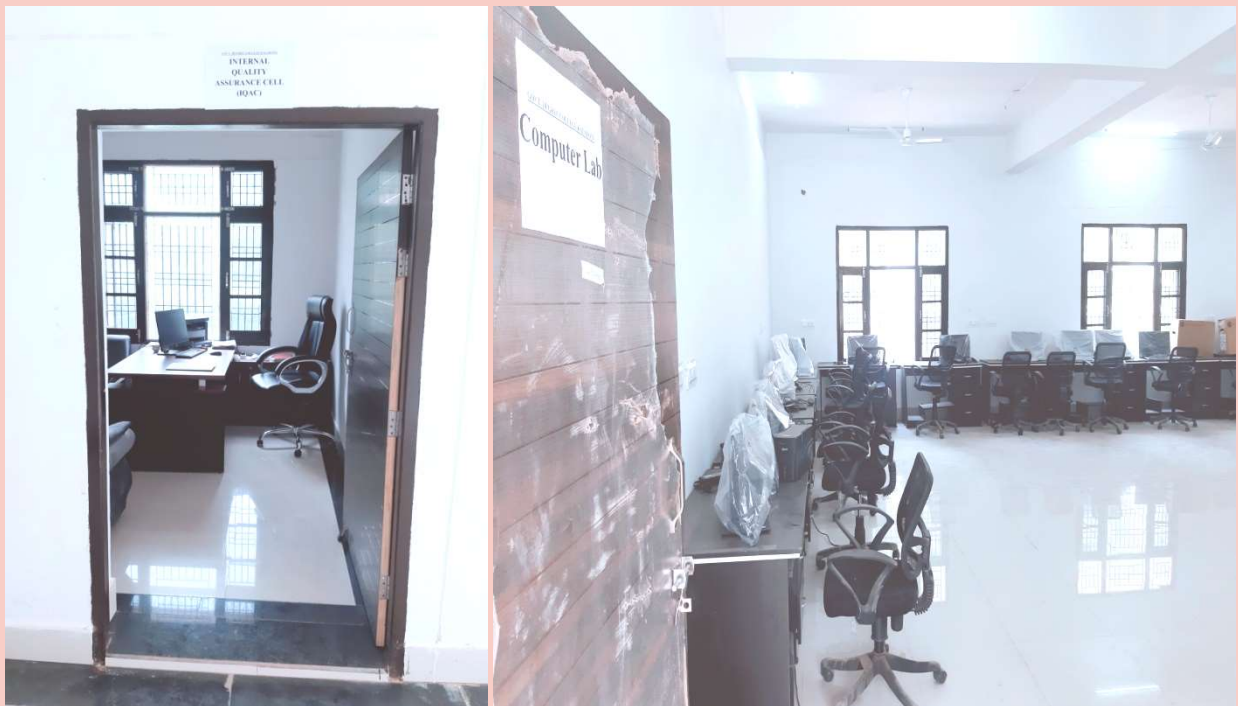
Students enrolled as NSS volunteers are required to put at least 120 Hrs of social work and attend one camp of 10 days duration to become eligible to receive a certificate. The special camp at university level and a national integration camp are also organized every year during **summer/winter vacations**.





Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

As per National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) guidelines, GDC Kalakote has established an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the overall performance of institutions.



Red Ribbon Club (RRC)

The red ribbon is an international symbol of HIV and AIDS awareness. Our Red Ribbon Club is working for the noble cause of awareness among the rural population about AIDS and other such diseases, which the society is facing.

Students' Body

In the beginning of new session, a students' body is elected in the college. The election process is very democratic and transparent. The college students have two representatives from each class - one male and one female - on the basis of general election. The class representatives' body is called student body of the college.

Ban on Ragging

As per the provisions of state anti-ragging law, the ragging is completely banned and whosoever, directly or indirectly commits or participates in or abets or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution, will on conviction be punished with imprisonment for a term, which may extend to two year or fine or both.

General Rules

1. No outsider is allowed to enter the college without a valid reason.
2. If a student remains absent from the college without permission for more than 14 consecutive days, he/she shall be struck off from the college rolls.
3. Unlawful assembly of the students in the college is banned.
4. Mobile phones are totally banned in the college.
5. Writing of graffiti on the walls or sticking posters is a cognizable offence.
6. Students resorting to unfair means in the examinations are liable to be issued a bad character certificate.
7. A student desirous of withdrawing his/her name from the college rolls should submit an application, countersigned by the parents/guardians of the student.
8. The withdrawal certificate shall be issued only after the student clear all college dues/outstanding. Such students shall in no case be re-admitted during the same academic session.
9. All the refunds should be claimed within six months of leaving the college after which the amount shall lapse.
10. The above rules may be modified as and when required.
